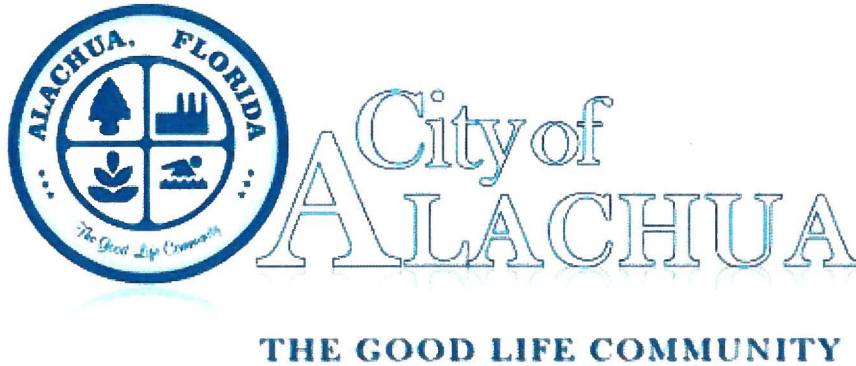

Finance and Administrative Services Director Bonetti introduced the item and provided the staff report.

Vice Mayor Hardacre spoke about the Mill Creek Sink Water Quality Improvement project. He stated he has heard good things about the summer camp held at Legacy Park over the summer.

Mayor Coerper stated that the White Cane Walk was impactful. He spoke of the benefits of K-9's for Warriors. He invited the public to take the "City of Alachua: Home since 1905" magnets.

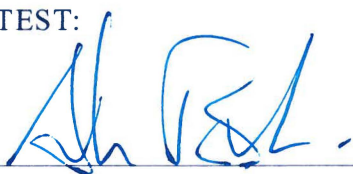
