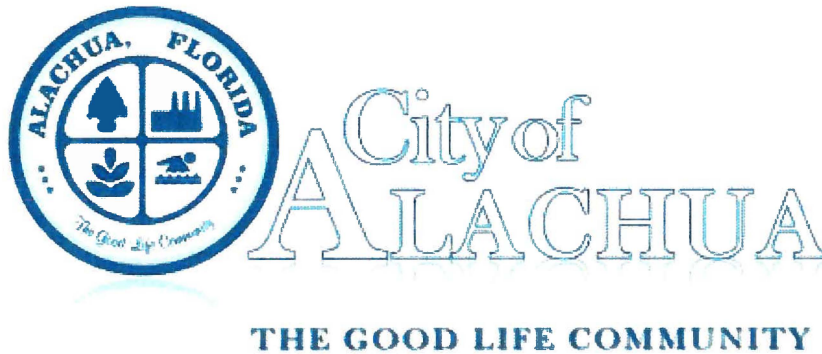

B. Inclusive Playground Construction Authorization

Vice Mayor Miller moved to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with Kompan, Inc. to construct the inclusive playground at a cost not to exceed \$580,000; seconded by Commissioner Hardacre.

Passed 4-0 by roll call.

Commissioner Brown spoke of how good this would be for the community.

She stated she felt the wisest thing to do would be let City Manager Boukari and City Attorney Rush continue to monitor the situation. She stated she went to a groundbreaking for a Wa-Wa store in Gainesville. She stated she attended Kiwanis and Rebuilding Together event to help a citizen in need. She announced the Youth Advisory Council would meet on October 24, 2019, at 4:00 P.M. She stated she attended the Black-Tie and Blue Jeans fundraising event for the Republican Party at Legacy Park.

Mayor Coerper updated the Commission as to the success of the White Cane Walk. He reminded the citizens to turn back their clocks on November 3, 2019. He thanked the citizens for coming out.

Passed by unanimous consent.

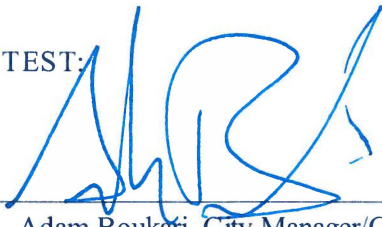
