Member Morris moved to adjourn; seconded by Vice Chair Grosz.

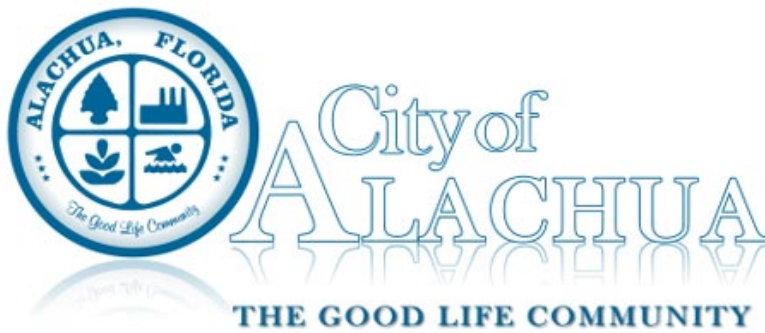

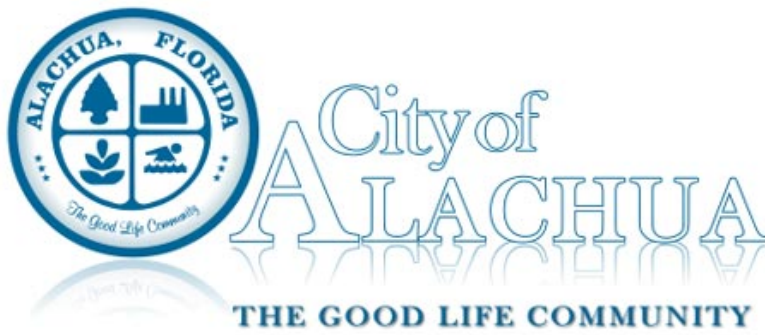

DEADLINE: FRIDAY, APRIL 15, 2022

Our future leaders are taking action in their hometowns to address local needs. The Florida League of Cities wants to help showcase these efforts through its annual community service contest.

OVERVIEW

We invite youth councils to submit current youth council projects that address a local need. Maybe it is volunteering at a community event, educating your fellow youth, or organizing a neighborhood or beach clean-up.

The deadline to submit projects is Friday, April 15, 2022.

APPLICATION RULES

The application packet must include:

- ① A written description in **500 words or less** that includes:
 - ▶ What the project entailed
 - ▶ What your objectives were and how they were accomplished
 - ▶ What needs the project served in your community
 - ▶ How the project helped the residents you served
 - ▶ How the project impacted your youth council.
- ② A letter of recommendation from the Mayor, Manager or a member of the Council/Commission.
- ③ Up to five photos depicting the event.

Your nomination will NOT be scored if missing any of the above.

The Florida League of Cities community service contest is open only to youth councils sponsored by a city, town or village government member of the Florida League of Cities.

The deadline for entries is Friday, April 15, 2022.

Judging will be based entirely on the youth council's submitted entry. The judges' decision is final, and all material received becomes the property of the Florida League of Cities, with permission to use it perpetually and universally, in any manner deemed appropriate by the League, with no additional compensation beyond the award money presented to the winner.

SUBMISSION

All work must be submitted through an online form available at flcities.com/resources/youth-councils.

Submissions that are emailed or mailed will not be judged.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF WINNERS

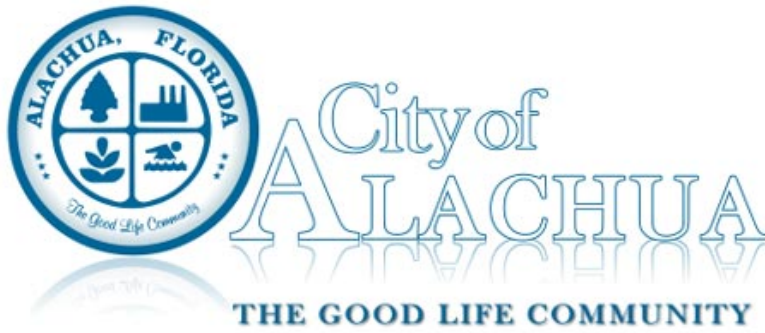
Winners will be announced in May 2022. Three projects will be selected as winners. Winners will:

- ▶ Be showcased on the League's website and social media platforms.
- ▶ Be recognized in press announcements and the League's Quality Cities magazine.

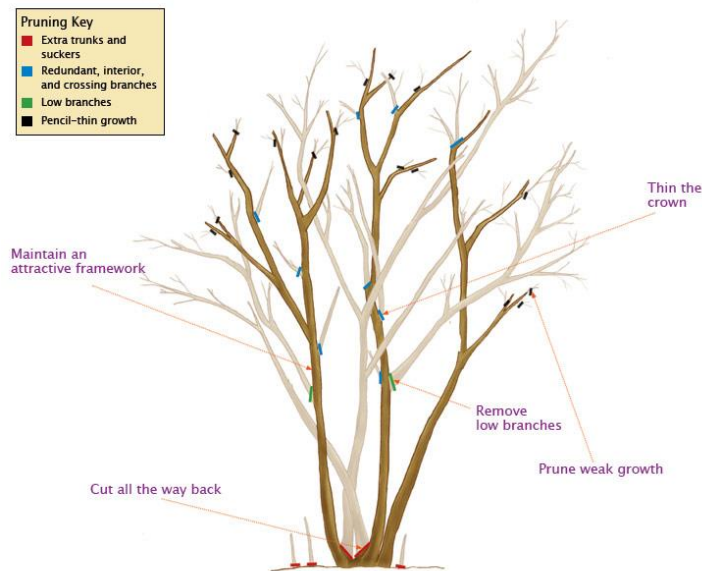
Youth Advisory Council Clean Up Project

San Felasco Parkway

The San Felasco Parkway is 1.4 miles that opens up almost 300 acres for housing and businesses specializing in life sciences, technologies and emerging technologies.

There are two types of trees planted along the parkway, Crepe Myrtles and Live Oaks. The Crepe Myrtle trees will be the only trees pruned. The Live oaks will be pruned by a trained arborist.

Pruning A Crepe Myrtle – 206 total trees



1. Start at the bottom, trim unnecessary trunks to maintain a few main trunks. Chose 3-5 main trunks.
2. Prune suckers and additional trunks as close to the ground as possible.
3. Remove low branches up to 6-8 feet off the ground. Trim branches back to main trunk.
4. Thin the crown. Remove branches that cross and/or touch other branches.
5. Remove weak growth.

Tools needed for trimming crepe myrtles

Hand pruners to clip twigs and branches less than 1/2-inch thick.

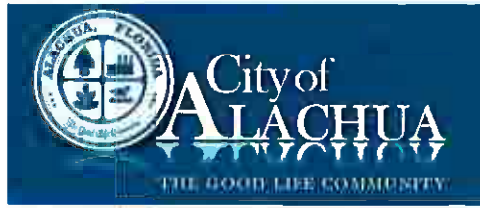
Loppers to cut branches 1/2-inch to 1-1/2 inches thick.

PPE Needed

Safety vests, gloves, eye protection, trash grabbers and sunscreen

Suggested clothing: long pants, long sleeve shirts and closed-toe shoes

The trash pickup area extends from the edge of road to 10 feet from the edge of the sidewalk farthest from the road.
